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WHAT IS THE COA AND WHO CAN JOIN?

At the COA, aspiring orchestral students learn how to play stringed instruments. Students as young as kindergarteners can learn to play violin, viola, or cello, and beginning in third grade, students can learn how to play bass.

WHAT ARE COA CLASSES LIKE?

In COA classes, students learn how to play their instrument with other students so that they learn how to play in ensembles at an early age. Each class has its own professional music teacher who is also an active performing musician in the Fargo-Moorhead-West Fargo community.

WHAT KIND OF PERFORMANCE OPPORTUNITIES DOES THE COA OFFER?

Throughout each session, students will play together in small ensembles and as soloists for each other. Family and friends are always invited to the COA concerts on the last day of each session.

WHEN DOES THE COA MEET?

WHAT IS THE COST TO BE A MEMBER?

- ♪ Levels 1-6: A \$200 membership fee for each ten-week session. Classes for levels 1-6 meet weekly for 30 minutes.
- ♪ Chamber Orchestra 1: A \$225 membership fee for each ten-week session. Rehearsals meet weekly for 45 minutes.
- ♪ There is a \$25 registration fee per family for each session (This fee includes educational materials, music workbook, pencil, stickers, certificates, and incentives.)
